land when its inhabitants were only a few stray sheep in the wilderness, and that He has been with the Church in her efforts to keep the white man true to the religion and traditions of his birth, and to Christianise and civilise the Indian—making the little one a thousand, and the small one a strong nation."

The Metropolitan, in his address to the assembled Synod, spoke thus of the late Bishop of Qu'Appelle:—"Though three years seem a short period in human life or history, we have been made painfully aware, by past experience, that they seldom fail to make themselves felt, even in our small body. The Bishop of Qu'Appelle, after some years of devoted labour for his Diocese, felt it his duty to retire. He did not, however, till he had left a happy memorial of his episcopate in the completion of an endowment of £10,000 for the Bishopric."
