FIRES.

St. Paul's Indian Industrial school in parish of Middlechurch, nine miles from Winnipeg, totally destroyed; loss \$25,000.—Manitoba Hotel at Portage la Prairie, Man., owned by Mrs. Haggarty; loss \$10,000.—Block at High River, Alta., occupied by Hyslop, Young & Kelly, hardware and furniture merchants, and the adjoining general store of A.W.H. Thompson; loss \$60,000.—Saw and shingle mill at Lakefield, Ont., owned by the White Company, completely destroyed.—Industrial school building at Mimico, Ont., damaged to extent of \$12,000.

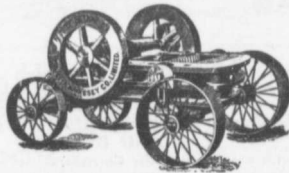
