

SILOING SHREDDED CORN.

I would like to know your opinion and that of anyone who has had experience in filling the silo with shredded cornstalks; that is, husking the corn with the shredder and putting the stalks into the silo, as they would have to go in dry. It is the opinion of many that corn put into the silo loses its value to a great extent. Would corn, saved out in that way by husking, cutting stalks into silo, and, mixed with other grain, fed to cattle, put on more flesh? W. J. C.

Ans.—There would be probably a risk of the shredded corn moulding and spoiling owing to lack of moisture. 
