animal life was created after its kind, but man alone was created after a heavenly pattern, after the likeness and image of God. Tradition hath it that Enoch was a great astronomer, and in the Welsh folklore we have still preserved the name of Cader Idris, (chair of Enoch), whither Enoch repaired to that mountain top to witness the eclipses and occultations not visible or only partially so in Asia Minor. Sanues Napisti is ordered by Ea to preserve all worthy writings, both ancient, medieval, and modern, so that those succeeding the deluge may retain a knowledge of the antidiluvian culture. The proof of all this is found in the ruins of the four chief post-diluvian cities, Babel and Erech, Accad, and Calneh, (see Genesis x:10). 
