"I have received and laid before The King, your Letter of the 2d March last; "transmitting an Address from the Council and Assembly of the Province of New-" Brunswick; and I am commanded to acquaint you, that His Majesty received " with great satisfaction the expression of sentiments so congenial to the principles " of Loyalty and Religion, which have always distinguished the Inhabitants of 1. New-Brunswick.
