

Registry Offices and the making of the plans and books of reference for Registration purposes in *Lower Canada*, being read;

The Honorable Mr. Attorney General *Cartier* moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Solicitor General *Langevin*, and the Question being proposed, That the Bill be now read a second time;

The Honorable Mr. *Dorion* (*Hochelaga*) moved, in amendment to the Question, seconded by the Honorable Mr. *Laframboise*, That the word "now" be left out, and the words, "this day six months" added at the end thereof.
