

ANTI-GAMBLING LAW. Interest Taken In Legal Proceedings to Beat the Law.

New York, June 22.—Racing interests in this city and throughout the country are profoundly interested in the case of Melville Collins, who was selected by counsel for the Jockey Club to be arrested at the Sheepshead Bay track last week in order that a judicial interpretation of the new anti-gambling laws may be obtained.

The legal question in the Collins case is whether a verbal bet accompanied by the passage of the money won or lost, but without the taking of a memorandum of the bet, constitutes a violation of the law. Collins had made such a bet, when he was arrested by the private detectives in the orderly collection of the Island Jockey Club, under whose auspices the races were being held. He was taken to a Magistrate's court, where he was held for a hearing to-day, but counsel for the Jockey Club quickly brought the case before the Supreme Court by securing a writ of habeas corpus.

The hearings in the case of the 19 bookmakers' arrests, at the Gravesend and Sheepshead Bay tracks were set for June 29 by Magistrate Voorhees in the Coney Island court to-day.

The hearing of the Island Jockey Club's application to make permanent the injunction restraining the police from interfering with the orderly collection of patrons at Sheepshead Bay, which was returnable this morning, was adjourned until Wednesday by Justice Blanchard, of the Supreme Court, to-day.

THE CIGARETTES. Consumption of Them in Canada Growing Rapidly.

(Special Despatch to the Times.) Ottawa, Ont., June 22.—The Inland Revenue Department returns indicate that the consumption of cigarettes in the Dominion is increasing rapidly and that the Government bill to check the use of tobacco by minors has been introduced into Parliament none too soon. For the fiscal year ending March 31, 1908, there were consumed in Canada 294,800,000 cigarettes. The year before the number was 253,000,000. In 1906 it was 209,000,000 in 1905 it was 250,000,000 and in 1904, 211,000,000. Ten years ago the inland revenue returns showed only 96,000,000 cigarettes for the year.
