Montreal, Nov. 16-Guilty of manlaughter was the verdict returned

slaughter was the verdict returned Saturday night by a jury in the Court of King's Bench against Pierre Valade, charged with causing the death of 13 year old ida Robertson on the 9th of September last. The prisoner will be sentenced some time this week.

The crime for which Valade was found guilty was one of the most revolting in Montreal's criminal history. The Robertson girl either jumped or was thrown from the fourth floor of Valade's boarding house and the medical testimony tended to show that a brutal assault had been committed upon her.
