A New York despatch of Saturday's date says: Steamer Whitney arrived yesterday with the crew of the schooner Clayola, picked up on Long Island Sound. Capt. Willis and men were without food fifty hours. The seas washed over the decks, carried hatchways away and spread mountains of ice over decks. The crew had a hard time to keep their blood in circulation till relief came. Four men were badly frozen and taken to Hudson street hospital. They were Charles Menash, 21, Prince Edward Island; Michael Beardon, 22; Albert Donostie, 22, Prince Edward Island. Captain Willis' hands were frost bitten and his tongue swollen. The mate was slightly frost bitten.
