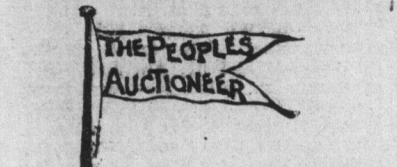

Tenders will be received at this office until noon on Tuesday, the 31st day of July, 1917, for a suitable steamer for the Mail Service in the District of Fortune Bay.

The steamer must be from 80 to 100 tons net measurement, fitted with all modern improvements, and to have accommodation for about 20 cabin and 20 steerage passengers. This service, which will commence as soon as possible, will consist of one round trip each week and will be continuous throughout the whole of each year. The steamer is to class "X 100 A1 at Lloyd's (England)" and to have a speed of at least ten knots. The contract to be for a term of ten years, to be computed from the date of commencement of the service. Tenders to specify the rate per round trip at which such service will be performed, which rate must include the board of the Government mail officer. 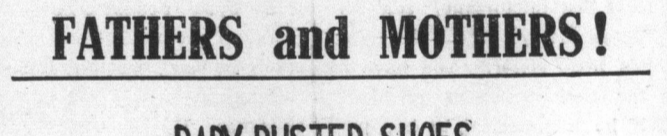

## Order in Council

Made Under the War Measures Act 1914-1916.

"All stocks of Salt held by mercantile firms, or their agents in St. John's, at Battle Harbour, and at such other places as may hereafter be designated by proclamation, are hereby placed under the control of the Tonnage Committee of the Executive Council, and no such Salt shall be sold, delivered or otherwise dealt with except under the authority of the said Tonnage Committee.

The violation of this Order shall be an offense triable before any magistrate; on conviction the offender shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars, and in default of payment to imprisonment not exceeding three months.

No. 1327. Code Telegram from Secretary of State.
