**Battle in Scotland** BETWEEN THE "WETS" AND THE

LONDON-A keen campaign on the part of both wets and drys is pronised in Scotland where returns have shown that at least 250 polls will be necessary as a result of requisitions necessary as a result of requisitions lodged under the Temperance Act. All the large industrial towns are this year included in the present arrangement. In Glasgow, for instance a poll will take place in 4 out of 37 areas. Two of these are already dry and several are under limitation. For a majority of the areas there will be three options, namely, no change limitations, and no license, while for the areas under limitations and no licence, while for the areas under limitation there will be four options, namely, repeal, continuance, further limitations, no licenses. In the dry areas the voters will decisimply for repeal of continuance.
