A CHILEAN HEAVYWEIGHT.

PARIS. Nov. 7 .- Quintin Romero-Rojas, a Chilean fighter, to-night removed another obstacle from his chief objective, the French heavyweight championship. He sent Henri Bluere, crashing to the canvas after thirty seconds of fighting in the second round. Only Nilles and Carpentier now stand between the Chilean and the top of the list.

Romero stands six feet one inch and weighs 198 pounds. The Chilean carried the fight to the Frenchman from the sound of the gong.

In the second round both men swung rights which landed at the same time. Romero took the Frenchman's blow, but the Frenchman went down like a log. He managed to regain his feet at the count of nine, but the Chilean sent another right to the jaw as the sponge was thrown into the ring.
