

MANUFACTURE OF COCOA.—We will now give an account of the process adopted by Messrs. James Epps & Co., manufacturers of diabetic articles, at their works in the Euston Road, London. —See article in *Cassell's Household Guide*.

An influential deputation from Belleville and the vicinity, headed by the President of the Grand Junction Railway, waited upon the Premier on Friday to urge upon the Government the expediency of making their road a link in the Pacific Railway. Their road is under contract from Belleville to Lindsay, and the iron purchased for 44 miles. They desire the Government to aid them from Lindsay to some point on the Georgian Bay, as furnishing the shortest and cheapest route to tide-water from the great West. The deputation departed well satisfied with their reception.

Engineers, under direction of the London City Council, have commenced another test of the Mill Ponds in Westminster, to ascertain their value as a source of supply for the city. A siphon has been inserted, and water is now escaping at the rate of four million gallons per day.

At the late sale in London of Sir Wm. Tite's library, a copy of the first folio of Shakespeare, of 1623, was sold for £440.
