century the people of Monaco considered it necessary to take their cue, not only in matters of fashion, but also in politics, from the Parisians. Honore III was the very counterpart of King uis XVI of France, the one being asy-going and kindly as the other. When France obtained the conces-tion of a National Assembly from Louis VI. Monace immediately insisted on laying one conceded by Prince Honore

When the French Assembly abol-hed feudal rights, the Monaco Assemy straightway followed him. When buis XVI made his vain attempt to Seesage from France, Prince Honore led from Monaco, taking his road to Paris, whereupon his subjects. like those of Louis XVI, organized a nadonal convention. When the Tuileries feasible grades. was sacked, Prince Honore's castle at Monte Carlo underwent similar treatnent at the hands of the Monaco mob
