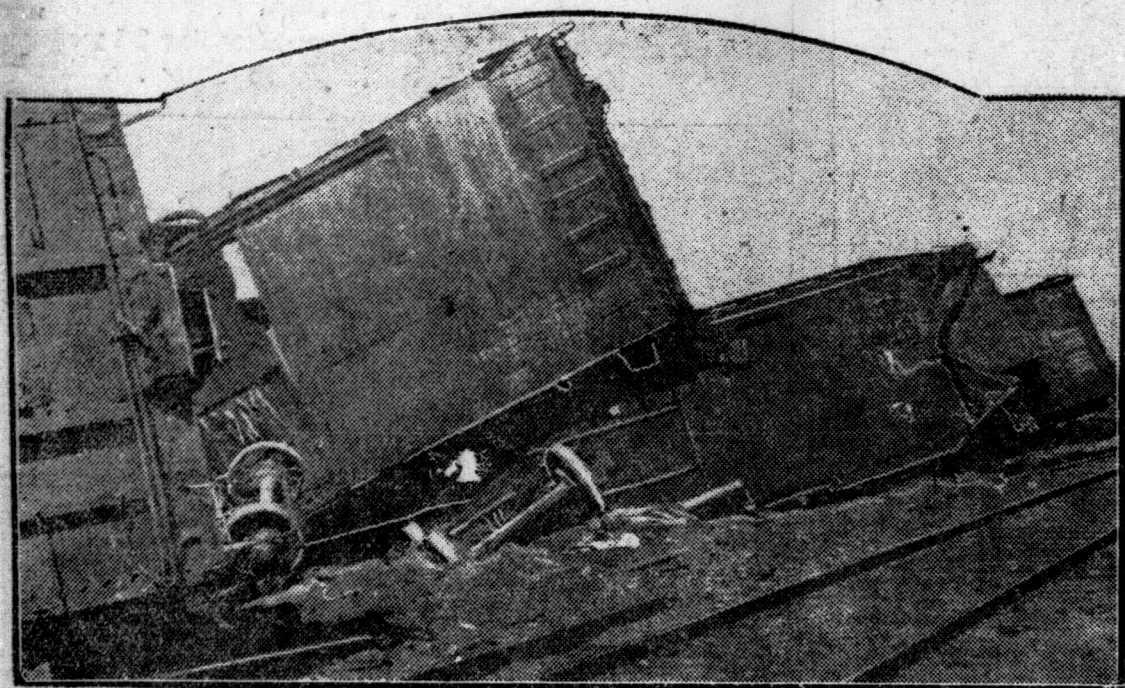


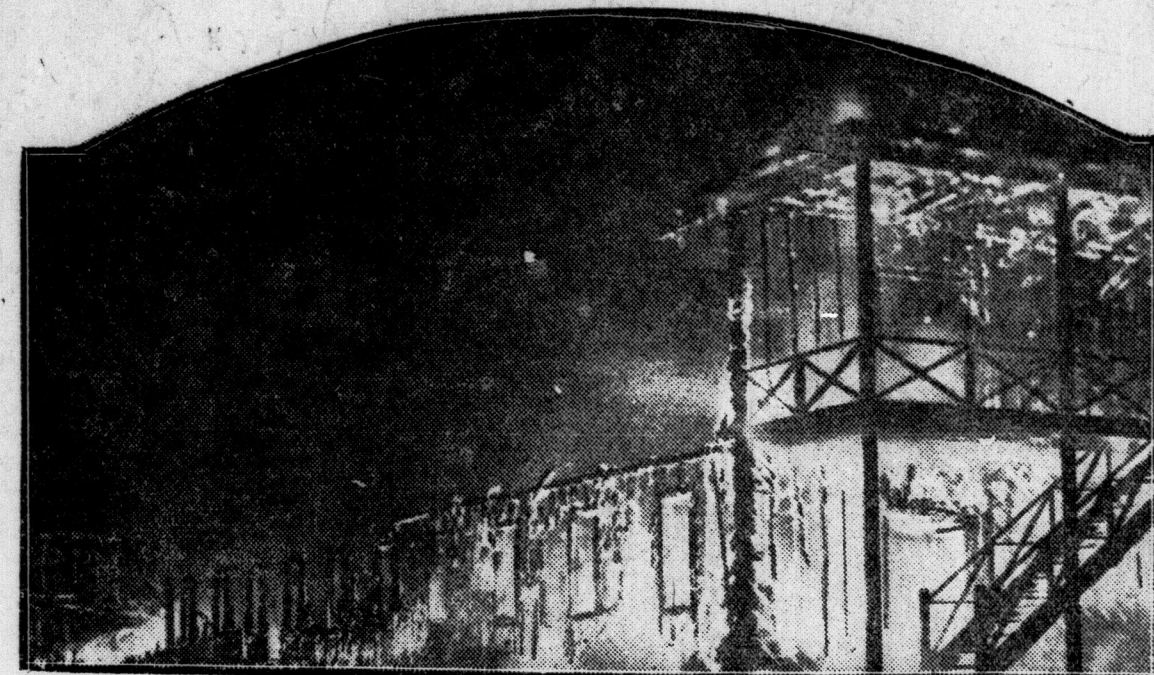

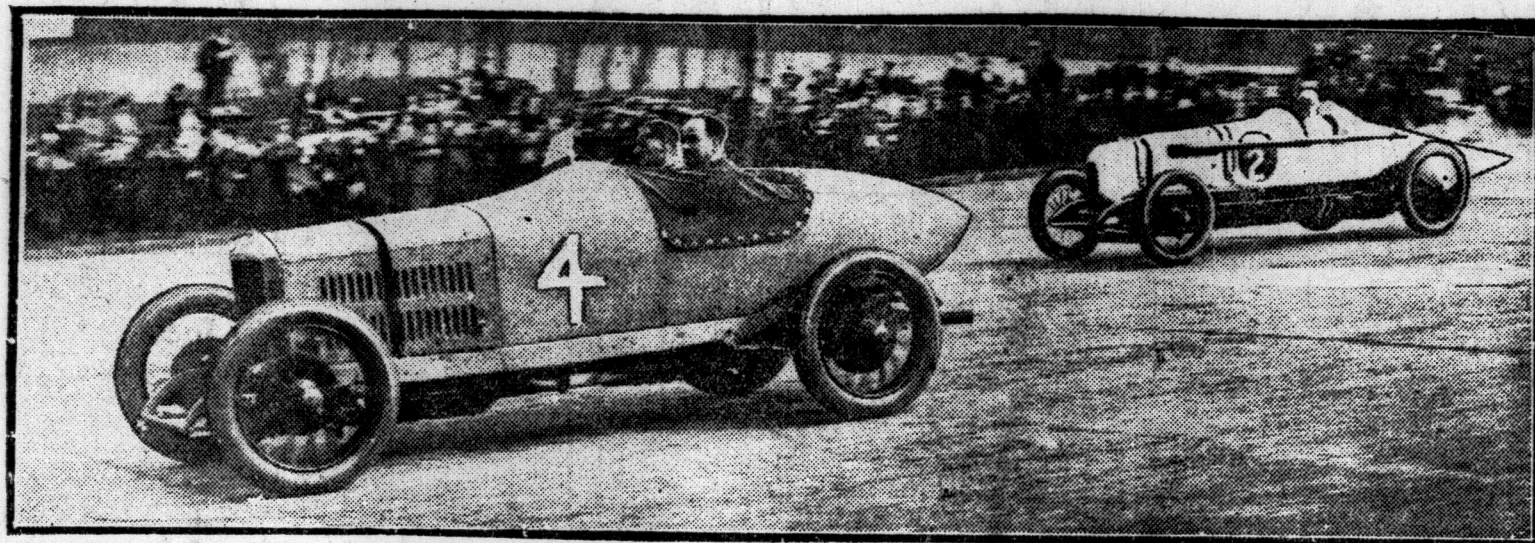
A pair like this will always beat a full house. William Scott Carter and David Scott Carter, Toronto's prize winning twins, who defeated all comers in a recent competition.

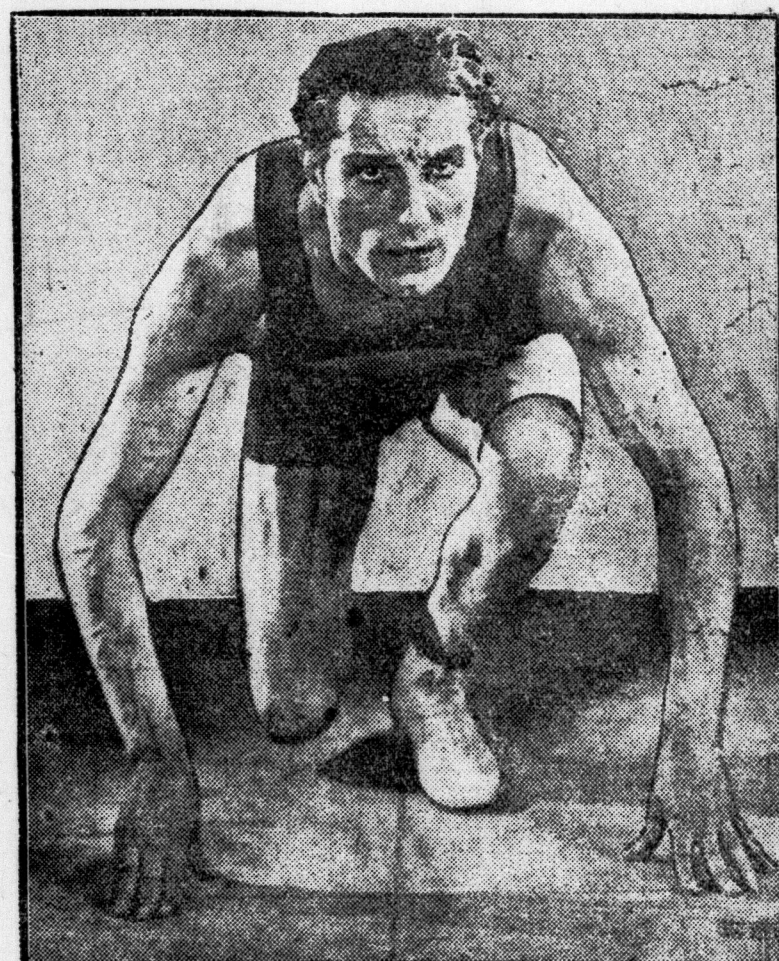
A very effective masquerade costume seen at one of the recent fancy dress balls in Toronto.



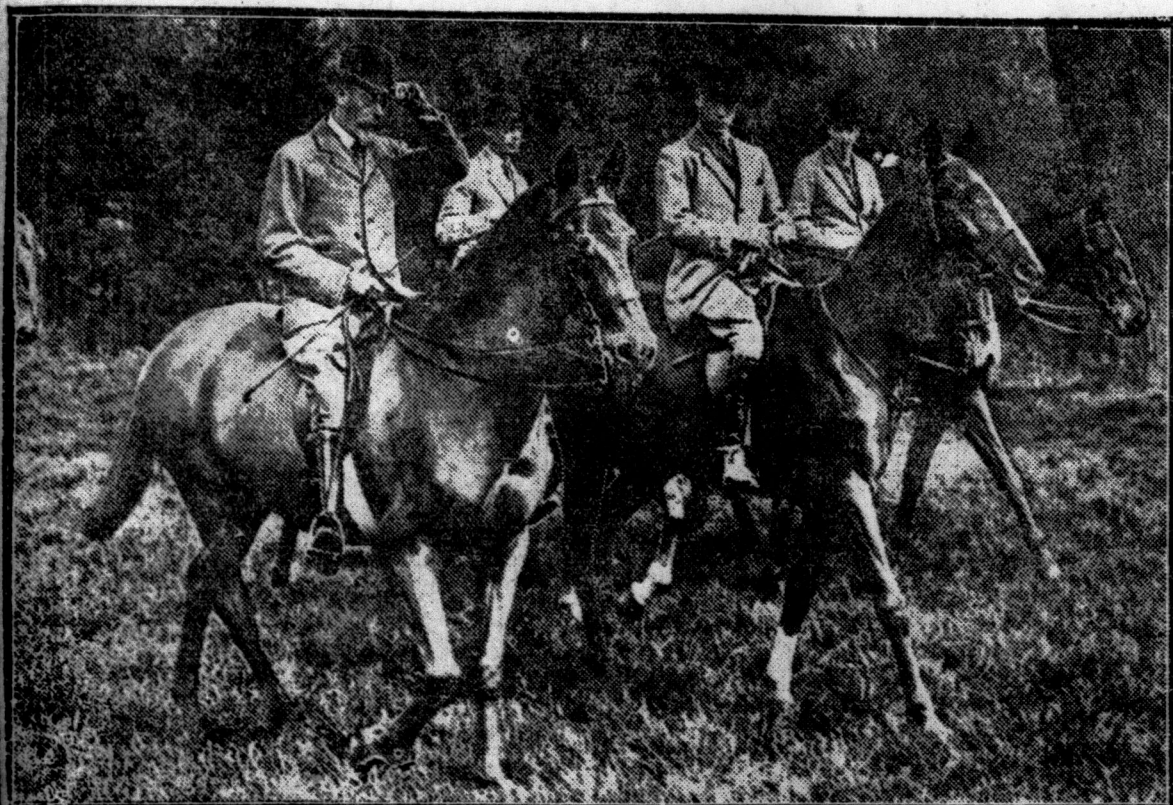
Something new in Tuxedo sweaters. It is of black and white fibre silk with a very unusual all-over Jacquard design.



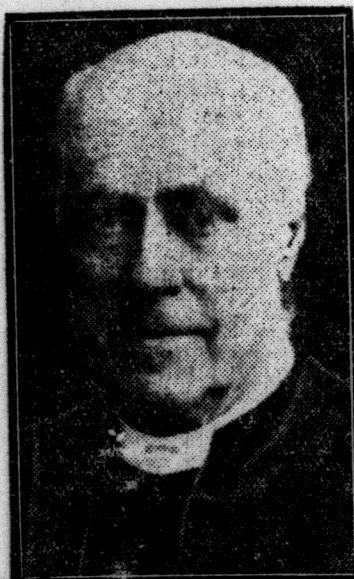
The latest matrimonial bulletin from movie circles says that Constance Talmadge is about to take a second plunge into marriage once her first divorce becomes absolute.



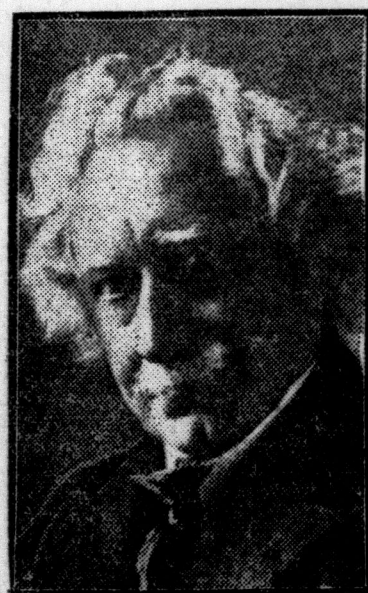
Charles de Roche, recently imported from Europe by a movie concern to play the parts formerly taken by Valentino.



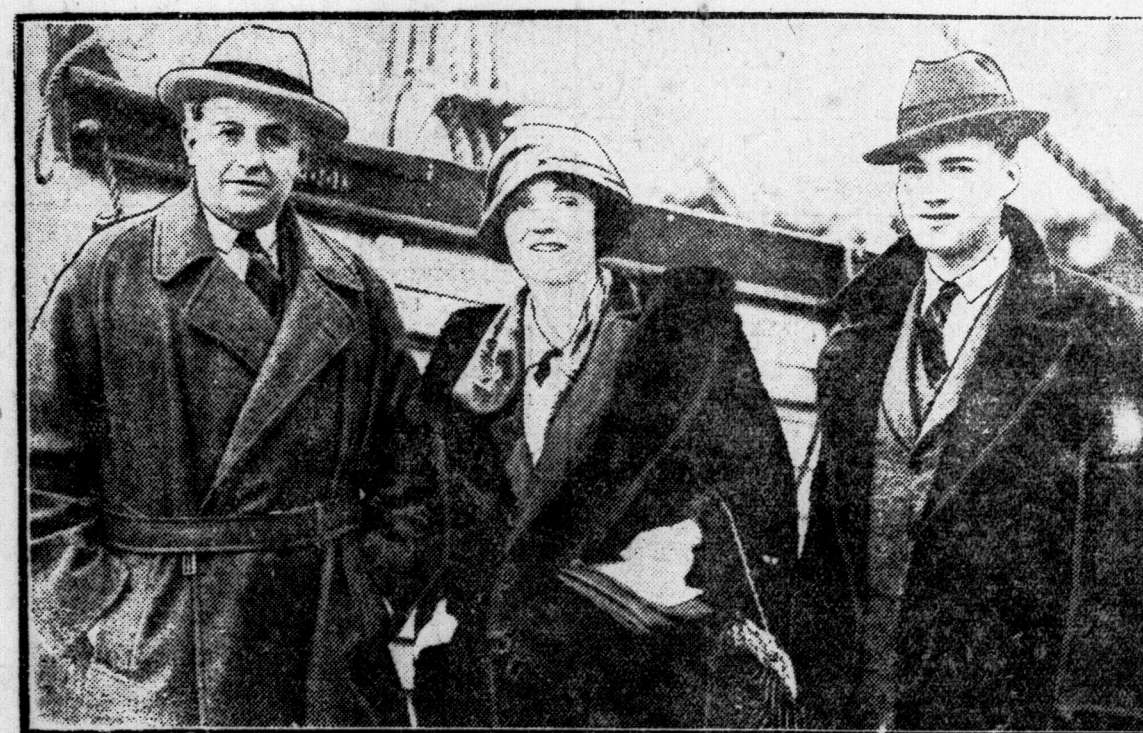
