

Monthly Report Indicates Londoners Are Patronizing Home Industries.

A healthy trend is evident in the ustoms and excise duties collected in London district for the month of August. That we are importing less and buying more from home industries is proven by the decrease in import taxes collected. In August, 1924, such duties totalled \$105,171.20, in August, 1925, \$97,575.88, a decrease

An abnormal increase in the amount of sales tax collected is the other feature of the report. This gain amounted to \$79,527.27. In August, 1924, but \$73,341.02 was collected from this tax, last month-the total was \$152,868.29. This more than disproves the oft-repeated assertion that less buying is being done in the district.


