## HOLSTIENS AT MAPLE GREEN FARM

Prize Herd and Record Cow Owned by R. L. Hicks, Dalhousie Junction.

The Maple Green Farm herd of Holsteins, owned by R. L. Hicks, Dalhousie Junction, was founded twelve years ago with the purchase of Maple Grove Patti, who, when she came to maturity, proved to be the champion R. O. M. cow of the Maritime Provinces, record 557.3 lbs. milk and 32.60 lbs. butter. Shortly after the foundation was strengthened by the purchase of her dam, "Belle De Kol Queen 2nd," and Maple Grove Belle 2nd, at exceptional high figures for those days. However, the wisdom of that course has been amply proven by the fact that "Belle De Kol Queen 2nd" made an R. O. P. record of over 15,000. Grove Patti is the champion R. O. M. cow of Maritime Canada. A grand-daughter, Abbecker Queen Countess, is second highest and another of her grand-daughters appeared out this year in the form Grand Champion in the Amherst dairy test. The female end of the herd as it stands consists chiefly of daughters and grand-daughters of the outstanding old matrons above mentioned.

The first herd sire used on the Maple Green Farm herd was "Maple Grove Mercena Mercedes." He was bred on the identical same lines as the world's record 7 and 30 day cow, "Rollo Mercedes," with over 51 lbs. butter in 7 days. Although used in a small herd, he left some outstanding producers; two of those deserving of special mention are "Abbecker Queen Countess," who stands 2nd R. O. M. cow of Maritime Canada, being beaten only by her maternal aunt, "Maple Grove Patti." Another of his daughters deserving of mention is "Lady Belle Mercedes," who gave in the R. O. P. over 16,000 lbs. milk averaging 4.1 per cent fat.

Following "Maple Grove Mercena Mercedes" was "Homestead Hanger," bred by Logan Bros. He is also a brother to Hon. W. M. Vale's grand old bull "Ida Rooker 2nd." Homestead Hanger's sire is one of this year's Grand Champion at Amherst dairy test in connection with the winter fair, also of Milly Pontiac Sadié, who gave as a Jr. 2 year old over 14,000 lbs. milk average test 3.8 per cent fat. Following him and the present herd sire is "King Kordyke Johanna," owned jointly with A. D. Preece and W. S. Wallace of Penobscot, N. B. His dam Jennima Johanna Wayne made over 30 lbs. twice before she was 6 years old. Her latest record being 32.32 lbs. butter in 7 days and milked up to 100 lbs. per day. She is a full sister to Jennima Johanna of Riverside, Champion R. O. P. cow of Canada, and Champion of the World for a cow of her age, with over 30,000 lbs. milk and 1250 lbs. butter. With such breeding as this you can reasonably expect Maple Green Farm herd to carry off their share of the honors in the future as they have done in the past.
