

BARNEY KING'S MOVEMENTS.

SEE NAPANE MURDER SUSPECT TELLS HIS STORY.

He Details His Journeys as a Traveller in Search of Work From the Time He Left Davis Bros., Prescott, Until His Arrival Home at Napane on New Year's Eve.

NAPANE, Jan. 14.—Barney King, or more properly speaking Barnaby Roy, now confined in the Napane Jail charged with the murder of Angus McLeod at Napane on Sept. 14 last, has authorized his solicitors, Messrs. Harrington & Warner, to make public the following statement in order that his friends may have an opportunity of verifying his account of his whereabouts at the time of the murder.

I am of French descent and my people live at St. Valier, Que. I am a journeyman coal maker and during the month of August last was in the employ of Davis & Bro., Prescott, and boarded at the Queen Hotel. On Monday, Sept. 4, I drew my wages from Davis & Bro. and went to Oshawa and spent the day, returning to Prescott at night. The next day I spent in Prescott, chiefly at Daniel Hotel. On Wednesday, Sept. 6, I went by freight train to Brockville and arrived there at 4 o'clock in the morning (Sept. 5). By this train I went to Port Hope, where I arrived early in the morning.

On Thursday I arrived at the Exhibition. I arrived in Kingston that evening about 8 o'clock and stopped at Mr. T. J. Teller's. On Thursday I engaged with Mr. Prevost at \$9 a week, but did not go to keep this engagement as I hoped to do better. I passed a night at the Queen Hotel with a broker whose name I think is Taylor. I proceeded to Napane, where I arrived about 4 p.m. and went down town. I saw Mr. McAllister on the street and also Mr. Hogen, and about 6 o'clock telephoned to the Big Store, Deseronto, where I went to see a freight train about 8 o'clock and stopped off at Belleville. During the evening I was drinking with the bartender and he told me that I was wanted by a policeman at the depot until the arrival of a World's Fair train, which passed through on Wednesday 4 o'clock in the morning (Sept. 5). By this train I went to Port Hope, where I arrived early in the morning.

On Saturday morning I saw an advertisement in the paper for a tailor at a village about 28 miles from Toronto. I cannot recall the name of the place, but it is in the vicinity of a railway map I think it is Norval. In order to get there I walked to Parkdale and took the train. The situation had been secured by another applicant, but the tailor, whose name I forgot, gave me a note to make, and sent me to a hotel to remain over Sunday. I think it is the only hotel in the place.

Next day I went to London, where I fell in with a young tailor whose name I think is James Hickman, and on Monday, Sept. 11, we set out together and walked to the next station and next day we arrived at London, stopping at one large town on the way, where we applied for work, but failed to secure any. We arrived at London on Tuesday, Sept. 12, where we also applied for work and I left my name with several tailors. That night we slept in a freight car near the station, and the next morning, Sept. 13, we went west to Wyoming, from Wyoming on foot to Petrolia and back again to Wyoming, and from there by foot to Fort Hare.

We passed through the tunnel about 6 and about 9 o'clock a train for Detroit, the next morning (Sept. 14) we were up in the Detroit freight yards and walked to the city. We spent that day in the city looking for work, but failed to secure any. We were in Detroit in places visited by me in Detroit. I remember breakfasting at the corner of Randolph and Catherine streets, and at several shops in Michigan-avenue and left my name with a firm of merchants in Jefferson-avenue, the junior member of the firm was named Spivey. They have since been burned out, I believe. They advised me to go to Jackson. That night we slept in a box car at the freight yard of the Milwaukee and Grand Haven R.R.

Worked in Ontario, Mich. The following morning I breakfasted at the same place as the morning before. We then went to a barber's and again looked for work and left in the evening (Sept. 15) for Port Huron, where I secured a room at the Mich. Kaand. I remained over night with the operator at the station, and in the morning went to board with Mrs. Macdonald, where I remained a week. There are dozens of people in Port Huron who can identify me. I have made no secret of my whereabouts, as I had no occasion to do so. I arrived back in Napane on New Year's eve, where I was greatly surprised to learn that I was suspected of having committed the murder of Mr. McLeod. Why my name should be associated with this dreadful crime I cannot understand. I would that the people whom I met on my trip from Prescott to Port Huron, and whom I met in Port Huron, if they would communicate with my solicitors at once.
