THE ENGLISH MAIL.  
H. M. Packer, Lord Melville, puts in  
possession of London, dated June 7, Fal-  
mouth June 6. We make room, in pre-  
viously crowded columns, for the articles of  
more immediate interest which late papers  
furnish.  
The London Morning Chronicle of June  
7, the latest London date, contains no items  
of importance. Its chief object is Sir W.  
Cortney, the minister, whose late conduct  
in Kent, occasioned a riot, and loss of ten  
lives.

Letters from Madrid, dated the 29th, con-  
tain the address of the new French ambas-  
sador, congratulating the Queen on the tri-  
umph of her arms. The debate upon Tithes  
had commenced in the Cortes; the Ministry  
proposed continuing to levy them for a year;  
certain Ultra would go further, and vote  
them on perpetuity, whilst the Exaltados are  
inclined to abolish them utterly. None of  
the leading men, however, had as yet uttered  
their opinions.

House of Commons, June 1.—The Irish  
Ministerial Bill has given occasion for a desul-  
tory debate, which terminated in the nega-  
tion of an amendment of Sir Robert Peel.  
The hon. Baronet moved that the qualifica-  
tion should be £10,000, and not £12,000.  
Lord J. Russell gave notice that he would  
propose that the qualification should be £5.  
This news from Spain is conflicting.  
Don Carlos is represented as in a bad con-  
dition. Portugal is said to be as distracted  
as Spain.

Part of the Great Western Railway, from  
London, was opened, and an experimental  
trip made on it. As evidences of the steady-  
ness of the motion, and confidence felt, it may  
be stated, that one gentleman walked along  
the top of the whole line of carriages while  
in motion, and that a member of Parliament  
wrote a neat Frank for a letter, while he was  
travelling at the rate of forty miles an hour.  
The Age, of June 2, has an article on an  
expected change of Ministry, but it is only a  
party item. There may be indications of a  
change, but nothing to be exactly reckoned on  
is yet visible. The Age exerts its influence  
to strongly prejudice the public mind against  
the "foreign" relatives of the Queen, who  
are expected at the coronation.

SOUTH AFRICA.  
We have three numbers of the Graham's  
Town Journal, of the 22nd, 29th and 29th of  
March. As usual, they are principally filled  
with accounts of Kaffir robberies and aggres-  
sions on the outskirts of the colony; but in  
the present instance these accounts are of  
more than common interest, and relate events  
of more than common magnitude. The file  
being so important we have only imperfect  
statements of the transactions; but such as  
we have we place before our readers.  
In the paper of the 22nd we find allusions to  
a report of a young English officer—  
Ensign Crowe—who appears to have been  
murdered by the natives.  
In the same paper we find a dreadful ac-  
count of the murder of 230 Dutch emigrants,  
men, women and children, by a chief of the  
Zulu country named Dingaan, in the vicinity  
of Port Natal. They had gone thither intend-  
ing to settle having been invited by the chief  
himself, and, upon the murder, treated with  
every appearance of friendship.  
M. Roke, chief of the Boroelongo, inhabiting  
the country north of the Orange river, had as-  
sued a proclamation in the Dutch, English  
and Rikaana languages, prohibiting the traf-  
fic in latest spirit throughout his domini-  
ons.

The latest information from the Zulu coun-  
try was by a letter dated March 19, in which  
feats are expressed that the American mis-  
sionary, Mr. Lindsey, with his family, had  
perished in the massacre of the Dutch emi-  
grants. The murder of Thomas Halsted,  
Dingaan's interpreter, was ascertained.  
Sir Francis Bond Head was entertained at  
dinner yesterday, at the Freemason's Tavern  
by upwards of 200 gentlemen interested in  
the welfare of the British Colonies.  
The chair was taken by Mr. G. R. Robins-  
on, late member for Worcester, and amongst  
those present were A. Chapman, Esq. M. P.;  
A. L. Leith, Esq. M. P.; the Hon. Mr. Bel-  
mont, Sir George Campbell, the Hon. Mr. Creighton,  
Sir George Head, Chief Justice Balton,  
of New Brunswick; Judge Halliburton of Nova  
Scotia; C. R. Fairbanks, Esq. of Ohio,  
master of the rolls; Joseph Howe, Esq. M. P.;  
F. Nova Scotia; Hon. William Crane, New  
Brunswick; Andrew Stuart, Esq. Quebec;  
Wm. Bailey, Esq. Montreal, &c.

COLONIAL DINNER.  
A Public Dinner in honour of the Loyal in-  
habitants of the British Colonies, in North  
America was given yesterday in Freemason's  
Hall.—Among the company were Sir F. B.  
Head and several Gentlemen from the Col-  
onies.  
G. R. Robinson, Esq. late M. P. for Wor-  
cester, took the chair.  
The usual loyal toasts were drunk with the  
acclaimed honours.  
The Chairman, in proposing the third toast  
"The Army and Navy," took occasion to  
express his high admiration of the excellent  
conduct of the handful of troops who had so  
gallantly co-operated in putting down the  
unnatural rebellion in Canada. (Loud ap-  
plause.) The names of Wetherall, of Mont-  
land, and Gore, would go down to posterity  
among the most distinguished of the patri-  
otic soldiers who had served well their country.  
The toast was drunk with three times  
three, and was acknowledged in appropriate  
terms by Colonel Lindsey.  
The next toast was Her Majesty's Minis-  
ters.  
The Chairman, after making some prefat-  
ory remarks, proposed "The health and fu-  
ture happiness of Sir F. B. Head," which  
was drunk with enthusiasm.  
The Chairman then proposed "the health  
of Sir John Colborne, Governor of Lower  
Canada," on whom he passed a warm eulog-  
ium for his gallantry in putting down the  
late attempts at rebellion. The Patriotic  
and the mother country owed a deep debt of  
gratitude to this gallant and meritorious officer.  
The toast was most cordially drunk.  
"The loyal inhabitants of British America,"  
was the next toast drunk, and was ac-  
knowledged by Mr. A. Stuart.  
The Chairman then proposed "The Earl  
of Durham, Governor General of British  
North America." The hon. gent. observed,  
that in selecting a nobleman of such high  
talent and integrity as this noble lord,  
the government had, at least, manifestly shown  
that they attached great importance to the  
maintenance of the colonial connection with  
the mother country, and he hoped that this  
connection would induce the people of Can-  
ada to receive their new governor in the man-  
ner he was so well entitled to expect.  
The noble Earl's health was then drunk  
with full honours.

THE CANADAS.  
The following prisoners sailed from Quebec  
for Bermuda, on the 4th July, on board H.  
M. S. Vessel: Wolfred Nelson, Robert Shore  
Milnes Bouchette, Bonaventura Viger, Sir  
mon M'Chesney, Henry Alphonse Guvion  
Toussaint Go'du, Rodolph Reverses, and  
Luc Hyacinth Masson.  
The Governor General and suite, Vice Ad-  
miral Sir Charles Paget, and Sir John Col-  
borne have reached Montreal on a visit.  
From a summary in the Albany Argus we  
learn that a detachment of sappers and miners  
a company of the 71st Light Infantry, a squad-  
ron of the dragoon guards, and about 400  
men, being the flank companies of the 24th  
regiment, and the dragoons lately arrived from  
England, all arrived at Montreal on the 5th  
from various points, and marched or sailed  
forthwith for Upper Canada.

The Montreal Courier of the 5th instanc-  
states that—  
"The communications between Major  
Wilmot, commanding on our side of the  
line, and Major Churchill, commanding on  
the American side, are understood to be very  
satisfactory. The American regular force is  
however, very weak. On the Missisquoi side,  
as we stated yesterday, the preparations are  
quite simple; especially now that the cavalry  
are out, to keep up the communications."  
The Earl of Durham has replied to a cumu-  
lous deputation of the inhabitants of Mon-  
treal, who tendered him an address on his  
arrival there. Referring to his efforts to re-  
store peace and prosperity to the Canadas, he  
says—  
"The task is arduous, as you state, but  
not impracticable, more especially after  
these and judicious courses which you have  
pursued. On my part, I promise you an im-  
partial administration of the government."  
Determined not to recognise the existence of  
parties, provincial or imperial, of classes or  
races, I shall hope to receive from all her Ma-  
jesty's subjects these public services, the ef-  
ficiency of which must ever mainly depend on  
their co-operative nature."
