Edmonton House, Saskatchewan; and his last appointment was to commence a new Mission at Bow River, nearer the Southern boundary of the great North-West territory.

After his visit to the Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, and Prince Edward Island Provinces, in 1874-5, upon his return it was too late in the year to commence building operations; he therefore concluded to spend his winter at Morleyville, where he was a valuable assistant to his missionary son, John McDougall, then employed laboriously in the erection of a new church and mission premises.
