jr., and A. N. P. Morgan remain posted until next term, and that they be then admitted if no objection appear then to have been made.

A report was presented from the special commitiee appointed with regard to the closing of $\mathrm{Os}_{\mathrm{c}} \mathrm{o}^{\circ}$ de stre r , selting forth that at an merview with the Deputy Adjutant General the committee was informed that the military authoritics were now of upinion that the proposition of the Iaw Society for a limited use of the grounds about the drill hall by the students of the law School for recreation purposes appears to be reasonable, and that the Deputy Adjutant (ieneral had received instructions to meet the committee for the purpose of discussing the terms upon which consent to the closing of the street mipht be given.

It was resolved that negotiations with the military authortics be continued by the committee with power to act, hut that in any agreement come to the following terms be embodied:
(1) That access over the street, for all purpeses comected with th Law wociety and osgonde Mal:, be preserved.
(a) That the right be reserved to the law suciety to reguipe the street to he opened at any time.
(3) That equitable provisions be made fur the limited use by students of the Law sichool of the the grounds enclosed for recreation purpuses, subject always to the ref inents of the militia.
(4) That any agreement mate be contirmed hy the Legishature.

The following report was presented from the Lithary Extension Building Committer:

The Library extension hat heen completed, and all acomuts in comnection therewith phisl.

The original estimates for the work were $\mathbf{\$ 6}, \mathrm{gon}$. These, housver, did not include the cost of providing electric light, which was afterwards fammd to amount to $\$ 310$. nor did they provide for the extra cost of insurance during l luilding operations, which anounted to 8106 :1t. There would have heen a considerable apparent saving in the cont of the work, all the contractors having been kept well willin their contracts, hut for the fact that the conmittee thought it desirable, since its last report, to make some additional provis'ras for the further enrichment and elatoration of the interior work. The result of this additiomal provision has, in the opinion of your committee, been to greatly improve the general appearance of the room, and to make it eminently sui'able for the purposes for which it is intencied.

A table, showing the amounts of estimntes, contracts, and paymeats, and appropriations heretofore made, is sumited herewith, from which i: appears, hat owing to ihe matters hereinbefore referred to, the appropriation of $\begin{aligned} & \text { so, } 900 \\ & \text { requires to be supple. }\end{aligned}$ mented by $\$ 393.59$ to meet the linal cost. Your committec respectinlly requests Convocation to make this further appropriation.

The additional Library accommotation providen ty the extension will meet our probable requirements for ten years from the present time.

The committe is of opinion that Convocation is to be songratulated on the acquirement of this anditional tervitory, and on the architectural results which have been obtained.
