Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Three thousand dollars be granted to His Majesty for Civil Government—Department of Labour—To provide for two clerkships in Second Division Sub-division B. at \$1,000 each, \$2,000; To provide for one clerkship in Third Division, Sub-division A. at \$1,000, for the year ending 31st March, 1918.
