

Division

(Translation):

Mr. Jean-Paul Racine (Beauce): Mr. Speaker, I should like to make a few brief remarks following an answer given to me last night by the minister to the effect that rural telephone companies were not included among the service businesses mentioned in this bill.

I know that many of those companies will be disappointed at not being included under the terms of this bill. We know that the Canadian association of independent telephone companies represents some 650 independent telephone companies in Quebec and Ontario which serve over 280,000 subscribers. In a brief dated March 23, 1959, they have already asked the minister to be included under the Industrial Development Bank Act. Such action has not yet been taken, I believe. It would have been a good opportunity for the minister to appreciate the problems with which those companies are faced. Being small companies, they cannot make use of public funds for their development.

The Minister of Finance (Mr. Fleming) has already answered a brief of those companies, I think, telling them that their requests would be considered at this session. I hope this will be done in the near future.

It was my intention to introduce an amendment, but I shall not do so on account of the very important legislation to be considered this afternoon. I hope the minister will give further consideration to this matter and, if he deems it advisable, suggest an amendment in the other place.
