ESTABLISHMENT OF POSTAL DELIVERY SERVICE IN WINDSOR MUNICIPALITY

Question No. 1,216—Mr. Beaudoin:

1. Is the Post Office Department considering the possibility of establishing a postal delivery service in the Municipality of Windsor and, if so (a) what criteria are required by the Department for the establishment of such service (b) what steps are to be taken by the Department until this service is actually in operation?

2. According to the Department, if the Municipality of Windsor meets the required standards, what is the approximate date on which this postal delivery service will be instituted?

3. Does the Post Office Department consider the present Windsor Post Office adequate to meet the new role it will be given if the Municipality's request is accepted?

4. Is the Post Office Department considering the possibility of recommending the enlargement of the Windsor Post Office if the Municipality's request for postal delivery service is accepted and, if so, what will be the nature of this construction or alteration of the present Post Office?

Hon. André Ouellet (Postmaster General): 1. Yes. A preliminary survey is to be conducted later this month to determine whether the area qualifies for this service. 1. (a) The principal requirement is the availability of at least 2,000 points of call in a compact, well built-up area. Subsidiary conditions are: 1. Walking conditions within the area must be satisfactory on a year round basis. 2. There must be access to the homes by means of pathways or driveways, where conditions under foot are deemed to be
