CHEDDAR CHEESE PRODUCTION

Question No. 2,260—Mr. Gauthier (Roberval):

1. During the past three years, what was the Cheddar cheese production in (a) the Albert Perron Inc. cheese factory at Saint-Prime (b) the Dolbeau Ltd. dairy and cheese factory (c) the Saguenay-Lac-Saint-Jean Dairy Co-op Association?

2. In what category have inspectors of the Department of Agriculture classified the Cheddar cheese produced in these factories?

Hon. Mitchell Sharp (President of the Privy Council): I am informed by Statistics Canada and Agriculture Canada as follows: 1. Statistics Canada reports that the information being sought concerning the cheddar cheese production in the factories of Albert Perron Ltd., Dolbeau Ltd. and Saguenay-Lac-Saint Jean Dairy Co-op Association cannot be released due to the confidentiality restrictions of the Statistics Act (Section 16).

2. The specific results of grading at each plant is considered confidential information. However, the totals for the three plants are: 1974, per cent first grade, 67.18, per cent undergrade (2nd and 3rd), 32.82; 1973, per cent first grade, 91.15, per cent undergrade (2nd and 3rd), 8.85; 1972, per cent first grade, not available, per cent undergrade (2nd and 3rd), not available.

PURCHASE OF SUBURBAN WAGON FOR USE AT PICKERING AIRPORT SITE

Question No. 2,263—Mr. Stevens:

2. No luxury options were specified on the requisition for this vehicle. Vehicle purchased was the only suitable
