THE ROYAL FAMILY

FAMILY LIFE EXAMPLE SET BY PRINCE AND PRINCESS OF WALES

Mr. Stanley Hudecki (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of National Defence): Madam Speaker, ours is an age where family life is seriously threatened by so-called marriage breakdowns. With divorce rates doubling in Canada between 1968 and 1978 from 124 divorces to 243 divorces for every 100,000 marriages, 456,000 children are now directly affected. When some current lifestyles are eroding Christian marriage and family values, there is a need for healthy family role models to help to restore the balance.

Today we are hosting such a role model in the persons of their Royal Highnesses, the Prince and Princess of Wales. This Royal couple, despite the heavy demands of public life, show a strong commitment to each other and are mutually supportive.

The Prince fulfilled his expectant father's task as "labour coach" at the delivery of their son. Both are comfortable and enjoy their child. Both take time out for family life activities.

Their popularity attests to the respect the public holds for a couple who so generously expend their energies in the duties of their calling and on giving and sharing love within marriage and the family.
