

*The Budget—Mr. Mazankowski*

The current Leader of this Government promised in 1980 that Government would keep the level of expenditures on a consistent basis with that of the then current percentage *vis-à-vis* the gross national product. Since 1968, Mr. Speaker, there has been only one balanced budget. What about the future? We have a \$31.5 billion deficit at the end of this fiscal year; \$29.6 billion for next year; \$27.9 billion for 1985-86; \$27.1 billion for 1986-87 and \$26.1 billion for 1987-88.

**Mr. Blenkarn:** That is if you believe its projections.

**Mr. Mazankowski:** Yes, that is if you believe its projections. And this \$31.5 billion deficit was to have been \$11 billion—

**Mr. Blenkarn:** That's right.

**Mr. Mazankowski:** —as estimated by the former Minister of Finance. Therefore, the problem, Mr. Speaker, is that this Government has no credibility. No one trusts it. No one believes it. The only way we will restore confidence in this nation is to bring in a brand new Government, and it will be a Progressive Conservative Government. Only then will the country be really working.
