

Mr. Speaker: I am sure all Hon. Members of this House are concerned about the decorum of the House. Our rules have been established through the years and apply to every Member. Sometimes the Chair has a little more difficulty in some situations than in other situations, but the Chair appeals to the Hon. Member in the interests of decorum and in the interests of the House to withdraw his unparliamentary word. I ask the Hon. Member to withdraw the reference to lying.

Mr. Heap: With respect, Mr. Speaker, in view of the gravity of the Minister's accusation yesterday I will not withdraw.

Mr. Munro (Hamilton East): Judge not and be not judged.

Mr. Speaker: Mr. Heap, I have to name you for having disregarded the authority of the Chair.

Mr. Pinard: Mr. Speaker, we are all very much aware of the practice in our parliamentary system under similar circumstances. The practice is very clear. I do not have to move a motion to expel the Hon. Member. Beauchesne stipulates very clearly that the House Leader may do that. In the past we have always supported you, Mr. Speaker, and it is clear that today we intend to do so. But I want you to know that we do this because we feel that a minimum of respect is required in this place and it is a shame for any Member to abuse the rule in the way the Hon. Member for Spadina just did. It is even more insulting that what he is doing is jeopardizing the passage of the Cree and Naskapi Bill today. He knows that, and his Party knows that very well.

Mr. Kristiansen: Order.

Mr. Pinard: Mr. Speaker, because we are to have a recorded division it means that we may not be able to deal with the Cree and Naskapi Bill, which we have reached agreement to pass through all stages today.

Mr. Nielsen: And the veterans' allowances, too.

Mr. Pinard: It is too bad that the passage of this Bill may not take place, Mr. Speaker. I see the people interested in it are in the gallery. Thanks to the NDP we may not be able to pass it today.

Therefore, I must follow the tradition of this House. I move:

That the Hon. Member for Spadina be expelled for the remainder of this sitting day.

Mr. Cousineau: What an example to Canadians.

Mr. Speaker: It is moved by Mr. Pinard, seconded by Mr. Munro (Hamilton East), that the Hon. Member for Spadina be expelled for the remainder of this sitting day. Is it the pleasure of the House to adopt the motion?
