MEASURE TO AMEND

The House resumed consideration of the motion of Mr. Wise (for the Minister of Energy, Mines and Resources) that Bill C-24, an Act to amend the Oil Substitution and Conservation Act and the Canadian Home Insulation Program Act, be read the second time and referred to the Standing Committee on National Resources and Public Works.

Mr. Speaker: Resuming debate. Is the House ready for the question?

Mr. Hnatyshyn: Mr. Speaker, I rise on a point of order. About an hour and a half has elapsed during the ringing of the bells. I wonder if you would take under advisement the question of whether that time counts with respect to discussion on the Bill. I just raise this by way of preliminary observation. Under Standing Order 75C, there has been a judgment rendered by your predecessor that during that particular proceeding the time which elapsed during the ringing of the bells counted in the time allotted under those particular rules.

It would be interesting for you to consider, in view of the fact that the motion to adjourn the House was made in the context of this debate and subsequently came to vote, whether the time that has elapsed during the ringing of the bells should be included in the calculation of time under the rules.
