fears of impending international wars. Mr. Buck says yes; Mr. deHaas says no.

TIM BUCK needs no introduction to any Canadian audience. His famous trial as the leader of the Communist Party in Canada some years ago made him a national celebrity, and his subsequent conviction and punishment place him, definitely, in the ranks of the great army of sufferers for opinion's sake.

I. ANTON DEHAAS holds degrees from Stanford and from Harvard University. He has taught the subject of International Relations in Stanford University, the University of Texas, Ohio State University, New York University, Columbia University, University of Rotterdam (Holland), and now holds the chair of International Relations in the Graduate School of Business Administration at Harvard University. He is also on the staff of outside lecturers at the Naval War College. In addition, he has served as special agent in Europe for the California Immigration Commission, and was a Captain in the United States Army during the war. Mr. deHaas' writings include "Foreign Trade and Shipping," "Foreign Trade Organization" and numerous articles in technical magazines of various countries, and he is the Associate Editor of several European magazines. He is a well-known platform speaker and experienced debater.
