last meeting, the Rev. J. M. Cramp, D. D., and the Rev. Theodore H. Porter. The former was among the first members of this Asz ciation and up to the time of his death has always taken a very active part in promoting the objects and defending the rights of this society. In recognition of his many virtues and the high estimation in which the late Dr. Cramp was held by all who knew him, your Committee have made arrangements for a "Memorial Service" to take place in the Baptist Church in connection with our Anniversary Exercises.

The Treasurer's Report which will be laid before you places the total receipts of the Society for the year at \$56.64, and the expenditure at \$42.54. The sources of our revenue and the manner and direction of the year's expenditure will be found there.

Provision has been made for the usual Alumni Dinner, which will be served at the close of the Anniversary Exercises of the College in the Academy Dining Hall.

The present Officers and Directors of this Society go out of office at this meeting in accordance with our Constitution and Bye-Laws, any of whom may however be re-elected.
