INTRODUCTION.

THE Terraqueous *Globe* (whose Superfice is the Subject of this Treatise) is always considered by Geographers as a Spherical Body made up of *Land* and *Water*, and (for the better understanding of it in its external part) is commonly surrounded with many Imaginary *Circles*. The chief of which
