The Windsor, a vessel of 6055 tons, was, according to a report issued here, sunk, while the William Dawson, an old steamer of 254 tons, has been blown up. The crew of the Windsor were saved, but five men of the Dawson's crew were lost.

### YOUNG OFFICERS WILL LEAD JOFFRE'S ARMY

Six More Generals Transferred From Active to Reserve List.

PARIS, Aug. 22, 11.25 p.m.—Six more generals, it is officially announced, have been transferred from the active to the reserve list. This is in pursuance of the policy of Gen. Joffre, commander-in-chief of the French army, in placing only young and active men in responsible commands. Since the outbreak of the war this policy has resulted in reducing the average age of French generals from 61 to 51.
