it the formal opening of the new rooms the matter of seeming the eres tion of a large storing and sorting eleyator in Winnipog was discussed at length, and was followed by the appointment of a committee, to act with one from the Winnipog Grain Exchange, for the obtaining of information bearing on the advisability and fearibility of securing elevators in this wity. The Grain Exchange was already in possession of a promise from the Canadian Pacific Railway authorities that if such an elevator was elected the company would give a site tu their-vards at a nominal cost.
