

THE committee of Directors of the Loyal and Patriotic society of Upper Canada, appointed to prepare for publication, conformable to the original resolution, an annual account of the proceedings of the society report :—That immediately after the first meeting, circular letters were addressed to the Directors and principal inhabitants in the several districts, inviting them to form Boards for receipt and management of subscriptions within their districts.

That a subscription was solicited and made, at York, by the Militia of that garrison, of one day's pay muster, towards the uses of the Society, which was announced as an example to the militia receiving pay throughout the province.

That representations of the objects of the Society were made to leading characters in the Lower Province, and to the Lieutenant Governor in England.

That the District Boards in the Eastern, Midland, and Western districts, have made report of their progress in raising subscriptions, which from their modicity, have been left at their particular disposal, since foreign subscriptions have so amply furnished means to accomplish the general objects for which one third of the district funds were to have been appropriated.
