FLATH CLAIMED HE WAS UNLAWFULLY DETAINED

Followed up Officers of Asylums With Extravagant Tales of Cruelty.
GUELPH, Dec. 20.—(Special).—At the sittings of the high court at Guelph, before High Justice Falconbridge, the only case was that of Flath v. Hobbs. This was an action brought by George Flath of Grand Forks, North Dakota, against Dr. Hobbs superintendent of the Homeowed Sanitarium, claiming damages for his wrongful and illegal detention in the sanitarium, from Dec. 28, 1905, to Jan. 1, 1906. The plaintiff claimed that he was not insane, and that he was therefore wrongfully confined and restrained of his liberty. He was admitted to the sanitarium at the request of his brother, Dr. Flath of Drayton, and upon certificates as to his lunacy from Drs. Lucy and Roberts. The evidence showed that he was decidedly insane and very violent. He was discharged in care of his brother after he had been at the sanitarium a week, and was subsequently, about Jan.

CONTROLLER CHURCH YET AFTER BOARD'S SCALP

Wanted Ontario Government to Investigate Conduct of Railway Board—City Hall Notes.
"At any rate, give the devil his due," said Mayor Geary yesterday when Controller Church launched another attack by asking that the Ontario Government be asked to investigate why the Ontario Railway Board had failed to deal with the street railway situation of its own bat. "We have got something from the board, let us see how it works out." The mayor said, however, that the city should constantly press for some relief as regards the Ronssevalles-avenue and Scarborough street lines, and the fact that York street was not being too much used. "We simply got that relief yesterday because the company did not oppose it," said Controller Church, but the mayor said the company had opposed the application vigorously. Those cars which did not have the P.A.T.E. appliances were yesterday deprived of the "have exact fare ready" signs and the conductors resumed business in the same old way. **New Traffic Rules.** Chief of Police Grasett yesterday submitted his proposed police traffic rules to the controllers, who sent them on to the legislation committee. They are: "Keep to the right and as near kerb as weather and circumstances permit, according to discretion of police." "Overtaking, pass to the left." "Overtaking, pass to the left." "Stop with right side to kerb." "Crossing street, take same direction as traffic." "Vehicles going north and south to have right of way over those going east and west." "Police, fire, mail and ambulance vehicles to have right of way over all others." "Reduce speed at crossing." "Vehicles not needing license to carry owner's name for identification." "Vehicles used for advertising purposes or for carrying coal, bricks, lumber, earth, etc., whether loaded or empty, to keep off Yonge, between Melinda and Albert, and Queen between Victoria and York, unless consigned thereto." "No drivers to be under 16." "Drivers to show police signal." Chief Constable Grasett advises that
