This contained items translated from all the European papers, and was printed upon fine paper from special type. All items which might be dis-posed to be disquieting to the czar were eliminated by the editors, and the uch news as was likely to please the

After the commencement of the war however, the czar insisted on also being supplied with "unblacked" copies of certain English papers, and these were sent unwillingly by the censors who, in times past, resorted to odd devices to keep certain publications from their imperial master, counterfeits etimes even being printed.
