BUTCHERS AND PLATT ACT.
SALVATIONISTS FOR THE YUKON.
 The Meat Vendors Think They Have Scored a Point.

Monday Night's Council Proceedings caused somewhat of a commotion. Ald. McAndrew's connection with the Business-Protest Lodge Against Meat-John Dickenson-General News.

Hamilton, March 30.—(Special.)—The back-draw of the Markets Committee in drawing from before the council last Monday its by-law compelling outside butchers doing business at the Central Market to pay a fee of 25 cents, instead of 10 cents, as provided by the Platt Act, is jubilantly coming victory. Chairman of Markets McAndrew, thinking that he had public opinion at his back, was determined to put the by-law through. The butchers, however, lost no time in making a vigorous appeal to the fairness of the city. They pointed out that they paid to the city fully \$1500 weekly in the way of fees and that they were far greater spenders of cash in Hamilton stores than were the farmers, and engaged lawyers to go to court to look after their interests. The Mayor and a number of the aldermen took alarm, and through Ald. Carscadden induced McAndrew to withdraw his bill and give the butchers a hearing. Monday's council was accordingly adjourned, and the butchers' conference was held. The Platt Act, which was the worst thing possible for Ald. McAndrew, was shown by the aldermen to be next year he expected to be an ex-officio member of all the committees, or in other words, "to keep in with the sweet notes" was shown by the aldermen to be when the aldermen went into the vote on the Platt Act, he had returned too soon, and he had returned until the votes had been finally recorded.

NATURAL GAS AND TOBACCO.
HOUSE OF COMMONS.
 The Proceedings in the Lower House Were of a Routine Character—An Early Adjournment.

Ottawa, March 30.—(Special.)—Sir Charles Hibbert Tupper, in introducing his bill to amend the act respecting the carrying trade of Canada, explained that it was designed to give to Canadian vessels a portion of the carrying trade of the Yukon. They were prevented by the United States coasting laws, enforced by a special act of Congress, from participating in the carrying trade to Alaskan ports, and he thought it only proper that the trade to the Yukon should be preserved to them. The Americans were, he said, taking the extreme course of preventing goods from one United States port, island or otherwise, being carried by a foreign vessel for any portion of the voyage. For instance, it had been ruled to be a violation of the United States laws for goods from New Zealand to be transhipped into Canadian vessels at Victoria and carried on to Lynn and Stewart.
