TITLED DIGNITARIES PREVENT PROHIBITION, BALK LLOYD GEORGE

Tennyson Smith Discusses the Liquor Traffic in Britain.

Mr. Tennyson Smith, anti-liquor orator and impersonator, delivered his fourth address on temperance reform at the Salvation Army Citadel last night before a well-filled house.

Speaking on "Why Lloyd George Cannot Bring in a Prohibition Measure in Great Britain," Mr. Smith dealt with the difficulties provided by the titled dignitaries and members of Parliament, who are for the most part large shareholders in the profitable liquor establishments of the United Kingdom.

"It has been frequently asserted," he said, "that the people are so wedded to their drink that they would not tolerate a prohibitory law. This statement is nothing less than a libel on the people of this country."

At times that the populace would revolt were their accustomed "bear" taken away from them, have grown used to believe that this is a libel. At a meeting I opened in the Guildhall, Plymouth, to an audience of 1,200 people, no less than 700 responded to my request that they sign the petition, and this is a proof that the majority of Englishmen are in favor of prohibition!

Must Be Discarded.

Drink, the scourge of the ages, must be universally discarded. The drink fiend, like the drug fiend, not only becomes a victim of his own weakness, but makes all those associated with him victims of his foehood. One cannot conceive of anything so despicable as the inveterate drinker. His remarks and his utter lack of self-respect are but unimportant phases of the drink evil compared with the misery his very existence gives to his children, his wife and relatives.

Realizing the misery suffered directly through the existence of public houses I cannot think that Lloyd George would not do all in his power to abolish the liquor traffic. The premier of Great Britain is as anxious as anyone to eliminate drink from his country, but he would have to face an enormous power which the organized trade has in the British parliament.

Was Frightened.

He was no doubt threatened by the liquor men when he attempted to make the fight, the fighting attitude of the whisky distillers was especially asserted with brazen impudence by the brewers to cast the responsibility for a continuance of the traffic is only a repetition of the old story of the liquor men—"Don't rob the poor man of his beer"—by which the honorable hypocrites mean "Don't rob the poor man's patronage and his money."

Englishmen will eventually introduce a prohibitory measure, continued the speaker. He is justly honest and revered the world over, but if he ever succeeds in carrying the national liquor traffic in the United Kingdom, his name will be execrated, and deservedly so, by all true temperance reformers for generations to come.

Boasting the rescue of John B. Gough, the great temperance orator, who was previously a slave to drink, will be told by Mr. Smith. He said that it will have special interest for the fact that it will be told in Gough's own language, just as he used to tell it more than thirty years ago. Mr. Tennyson Smith commenced his career as a temperance lecturer by reciting the ora-
