FARMS RUNNING DOUBLE SHIFTS Seeding Progressing Rapidly in Western Provinces. Calgary, Alta. May 8.—Seeding is progressing satisfactorily throughout southern Alberta, according to reports received here by the Canadian Pacific Railway. The surface of the soil is drying very fast under spring sun-drying and warm winds, and the farmers say the prospects are the best in many years. If the weather continues, the crops will be normally advanced by the middle of June. On the Noble Foundation at Nobleford, where 19,000 acres are being seeded, double shifts are being run, seeding being carried on from two in the morning until nine at night. Efforts are being made to greatly increase the acreage first anticipated.
