According to the figures compiled by the Record Office, Ottawa, the total number of casualties among officers and men of the Canadian expeditionary for-

In the midnight casualty list appears the names of seven New Brunswick men: Wounded, Lance Corporal W. D. Smith, St. John; Sergeant Wilfred D. Stewart, Clarence street, St. John; Lance Corporal J. P. Phelm, Chatham; J. Anson Nelson, St. John; Alfred Reed, Minto; Louis P. Bradley, Sussex, and Lieut-Robert B. Campbell, Woodstock. Was With 55th

Lieutenant Stewart Simpson, of Charlottetown, who was reported in yesterday's casualty list as killed in action, was a member of the 55th battalion and later the 5th C. M. R. He was on the staff of the Bank of Commerce in Halifax for two years. He was the son of Canon Simpson of All Saint's Cathedral, Charlottetown.

That Private Albert McAlpine, formerly of this city was killed in action, was the word received by his father, John D. McAlpine of Edmonton, who was in Ottawa yesterday. Private McAlpine was born here where several of his relatives still live, including Dr. McAlpine of Princess street and H. M. McAlpine of Horsfield street, who are uncles.
