### WHAT IS THE GAME.

(Toronto Star)

In a signed leading editorial in the Montreal Star Sir John Willison lays the present lack of leadership in the public life of Canada. The Ottawa government does nothing to meet the needs of the time nor to attract the attention of the country, while those in opposition at Ottawa are equally barren of resource.

The situation as described forms a sort of companion picture for the Montreal Star's well known landscape "The Whisper of Death," which attracted so much attention when recently exhibited all across the country. It was hung on the line, or at so much per line, in the news columns of many of our contemporaries. Just why the money was spent in broadcasting damaging and discouraging views about Canada's future nobody has explained although many have ventured a guess.

Sir John Willison's article is a sort of supplementary instalment of discouragement to that already delivered by Lord Atholstan. But he confines himself pretty well to his subject. What he says may be put in a nutshell in these words: "Nobody is out in front trying to lead us anywhere."

Anyone opposed to the political party in office at Ottawa may say that, and any party in office at Ottawa may expect that its opponents will say that of it, unless they can frame up some more serious charge. But what many begin to believe is that what the Montreal Star and those who write for it are trying to do is to lay down a barrage all around the Ottawa government in the hope that Mr. Meighen, who isn't far away, will get caught in the explosions and be reported missing when the din is over. The attack is on everybody, but, on the artillery maps, X marks the spot where all firing is to converge. The idea is to get Mr. Meighen. They want to shoot him without shooting at him. This puts tact in their tactics.

The purpose behind it all quite evidently is the belief that there can be launched a new party which will have the courage of its campaign fund, which will stand up for peace and when the hold old way of handling the populace would win out every time. There is a group in Montreal which believes that too much difference has been shown the multitude. They wish reaction. They are quite interested in the success of the Fascist and believe that more than a hint can be got there. They think too.
