TYPHUS DANGER IN POLAND GREAT

Aid Must Come, Says Report, or All Europe Will be Threatened.

Warsaw, Oct. 18.—(A. P. Correspondence).—Poland is in far worse condition from typhus fever dangers than ever in her history, says a report of Colonel Harry L. Gilbert, commander of the American Polish Relief Expedition which has been co-operating with the Polish government more than a year in an effort to wipe out the disease. "Unless outside aid is forthcoming at once," says the report, "suffering will be intense during the approaching winter and all Europe will be threatened with a terrible typhus fever epidemic."

SITUATIONS VACANT

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Supplies of steel are coming to hand fairly well, but there are lines yet where a large unutilized business is waiting for deliveries. Sheets are scarce and wanted. Tubes come in, but not sufficient, and the prices are firm. Compared with pre-war days, it may be stated that four-inch tube—which is standard size—today sells for 65 cents a foot, against 20c, which may be called a fair pre-war figure.
Machine tool houses are not doing a large business, but there is a scattered selling that is making figures fairly representative when compared with previous months this year. The small tool trade has the same experience. A large number of small orders is the general report, no very large buying being done.
Scrap metal dealers are waiting for a turn in affairs, as their business is very much unsettled. Eren were it to become established on a lower basis they might be able to go ahead, but it does not seem possible to reach that lower level with the knowledge that it will provide a real working basis.
