TO LET 1,500 DOCTORS OUT.

Washington, April 12.—Elimination from the Army Medical Reserve Corps of all men not qualified for active service has been undertaken by Surgeon-General Gorgas. It is estimated that about 1,600 commissions will be revoked.

A circular letter sent to the 4,000 members of the corps on the inactive list said the surgeon-general had found it necessary to discharge all officers who, because of age or other reasons, would be unable to respond to a summons to active duty, and asked from each officer detailed information as to his present situation.

A campaign to rebuild the Medical Reserve Corps is under way, the American Medical Association co-operating with the military authorities to reach physicians throughout the country.

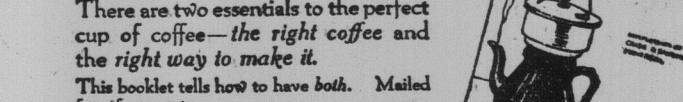
