#### STEAMER ASHORE IN PETITGODIAG RIVER

MONCTON, Aug. 24.—The steamer Wilfrid C., which left here this mornng about nine-thirty with the Brothergood of Locomotive Firemen excursion to Hopewell Cape Rocks, got stuck on the flats about two miles down river and is hung up high and dry.
