Continued From Page One. With regard to secondary and higher education in relation to industrial training and technical education, the opinion is expressed that:

EDUCATIONAL SYSTEM

Secondary vocational education should be provided for those persons who are to follow manual industrial occupations, producing occupations, such as agriculture, conserving occupations, such as housekeeping, and commercial and business occupations.

EDUCATIONAL SYSTEM

Secondary education for those who have gone to work should be provided in day and evening classes in close co-operation with their occupations while they are still learners.

EDUCATIONAL SYSTEM

That increasing attention should be given to opportunities which now exist or which may be provided, for the conservation of life and health through the development of human powers.

For those who are to continue at schools in urban communities: Division 1—Any intermediate industrial classes necessary in a system.
