Paris, Feb., 14.—Revision of the Sevres treaty between the Allies and Turkey is being opposed by every means at his disposal by Former Premier Venizelos of Greece, he declared in an interview published by the Petit Parisien, M. Venizelos takes occasion to deny recent reports that he has entered into relations with King Constantine of Greece.

"I cannot fight officially and openly," he says, "but I can, at least in private talks, plead my country's cause, and advance all arguments that seem convincing. I am working in the buckground ardently for what I believe to be justice. I have made no arrangements with Constantine, but, as I am a Greek, it is my duty to defend, always and everywhere, my little homeland against the ills which may assail ber, it makes no difference to me if my efforts coincide and are confounded with those of the royal house, I will do anything the higher interest of my country requires. Those who do not understand that are poor creatures.
