

When surveyors prepare to plot off sections of land into squares, circles, parallelograms, and irregular areas, they find it necessary to place something in their instruments whereby a point may be fixed definitely, precisely, and within a fraction of an inch, even though the point at which the instrument is directed be a mile distant. 
