CONVICTION BY JUDGE BELL

Attempted Personation at St. Thomas in Referendum Vote.

Other Cases to Follow—The Penalty a Severe one—Counsel Questions Jurisdiction.

St. Thomas, Jan. 19.—The postponed investigation of the charges laid by the temperance people against Robert Foster, Wm. H. Walsh, and H. A. Branton, was resumed at the court house before Judge Bell, of Chatham, to-day.

John A. Robinson, counsel for the accused, raised some technical points as to Judge Bell's jurisdiction, and also to the validity of the warrant issued against Foster. However, his objections were over-ruled.

It was decided to try the accused individually, and the case against Foster was first taken up. He was accused of trying to impersonate one Orville Murphy, a commercial traveler, who resides in this city, but was in the Northwest on the day the referendum vote was taken.

James Carrie, D. R. O., Andrew Clark, poll clerk, and J. C. Hawkins, scrutator, all swore that Foster attempted to vote for Murphy, but was caught in the act, and the vote was not put in the ballot box.

The judge found accused guilty, and is to be brought up to-morrow for sentence. It might be stated, however, that Mr. Robinson appeared for Foster, the latter being out on bail, and it is alleged is somewhere in New York state, consequently he is not likely to appear.

The penalty is \$400 fine and one year imprisonment.

The other two cases, which are attempts at stuffing ballot boxes, will come up to-morrow.
