CARTWRIGHT, Hon., SIR RICHARD JOHN, K.C.M.G., P.C. (South Oxford.)

S. of the late Rev. R. D. Cartwright, Chaplain to the Forces of Kingston; and grands. of Hon. Richard Cartwright, a U.E. loyalist, who was a mem. of the first Parlt. of U.C., which met in 1792, and continued to hold a seat in that body until his death, 1815. B. at Kingston 4 Dec., 1835. Ed. at Trin. Coll., Dublin. M., Aug., 1859, Frances, eldest dau. of the late Col. Alex. Lawe. Was Presdt. of the late Commercial Bank H.E.I.C.S. Author of a pamphlet on the Militia question of Can. (1864). Sworn of the Privy Council and apotd. Minister. of Finance of Can., 7 Nov., 1873, which position he held until the resignation of Mr. Mackenzie's administration, Oct. 1878. Proceeded to England on public business. 1874 and 1875, and again in 1876. Sat for Lennox and Addington in Can. Assem. from 1863 until the Union. Returned to Commons for Lennox at g.e., 1867; again at g.e. 1872; again on his appt. to office; and by acclamation at g.e., 1874. An unsuccessful candidate at g.e. 1878, elected for Huron on resignation of Mr. Horton, the sitting mem., 2 Nov., 1878. An unsuccessful candidate for Wellington County at g.e., 1880. Returned by acclamation for South Huron on the resignation of the sitting mem., Mr. McMillan, Dec., 1883. Re-elected for present seat at g.e., 1887 and 1891. Created a K.C.M.G., 1879.
